#### From the Principal – Mr. Bob Morris

1 Timothy 4:12 "Don't let anyone look down on you because you are young, but set an example for the believers in speech, in life, in love, in faith and in purity."

Sometimes we come across a person whose life is taken what seems to be too early. We can go back in history and identify people whose death made us wonder why and what could have been. On September 10, 2025, we learned of the horrific assassination of Charlie Kirk, 31 years old while hosting a question debate at a university in Utah.

Last year, during a grade two activity, the students were asked what they would like to be when they grow up. This is a common pondering and I remember when I was young and students would say police officer, baseball player, doctor, nurse. There were a few students last year that indicated that they wanted to be a social media influencer when they grew up. At first, I was

taken back on the answer wondering how an 8-year-old would even know what a social media influencer is.

Since Charlie Kirk's assassination, I became aware of his ability to be an influencer. He attended one semester of university and dropped out to pursue political activism. He created Turning Point USA to challenge college aged students to get involved with politics and would openly debate anyone. He was very passionate for his country, and he was passionate about his faith in God. He often said that it was his goal to "Make Heaven crowded." He stood boldly for truth even though culture pushed back. Charlie Kirk reflected Paul's charge to Timothy in 1 Timothy 4:12.

We are all called to be an influencer. Matthew 5:16 states, "In the same way, let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven." Thanksgiving is a time to pause, reflect, and give God glory for His blessings. Gratitude is not simply about abundance on the table, but about living a life that points back to Christ. Paul's charge to Timothy reminds us that thanksgiving is not only spoken, it is shown in how we live every day.

Charlie Kirk, in much of his work with young people, often emphasizes courage, conviction, and standing boldly for truth even when culture pushes back. That spirit echoes Paul's encouragement to Timothy: do not be dismissed because of your youth but instead live with integrity that honors God. Thanksgiving, then, becomes more than a holiday; it becomes a lifestyle of courageously thanking God through our words, conduct, and faith.

When believers set an example in gratitude, by refusing to complain, living generously, loving sacrificially, they shine in a world that too often takes blessings for granted. True thanksgiving is countercultural. It's not rooted in entitlement but in humility before God, who provides every good thing.

This Thanksgiving, may we, whether young like Timothy or seasoned with years, be examples of faith and gratitude. May our thankfulness go beyond words at the dinner table, becoming a witness that inspires others to look to Christ, the giver of all good gifts.

BTW: If anyone is interested in a podcast from an eyewitness account from that day of the assassination, I recommend September 16 "I Don't Have Enough Faith to be an Atheist" by Dr. Frank Turek.
