I am really enjoying teaching Grade Five and Six Bible this year. The course focuses on the New Testament. We had a unit on the Triumphal Entry through Passover and a unit on Jesus' Death. One of my deep hopes for this curriculum is that I hope it becomes alive when they learn about the last days of our Saviour's life and hear those messages during Good Friday and Easter Sunday.

Bible memory is something that I have been pondering with the class. We had a very long passage (Luke 14:1-14). We worked hard in class (and at home) to practice saying it and writing it. The passage was tied to what we were learning in unit 4 and it was hard. One thing that was amazing was how quick the students learned the passage. There were only a few that ended up waiting until the last day to recite it.

This ability to learn passages by students is something I think about often. Most youth are more resilient and can learn so much. Let's be honest, when our electronics glitch, we ask someone young to fix it and somehow, they just know how to do it.

Young people end up doing amazing things. My all-time favourite basketball player, Larry Bird, joined the Celtics during the 1979-80 season and won rookie of the year and helped Boston win 32 more games that year than the previous season. Magic Johnson entered the NBA in the same year and won an NBA Championship while playing all five positions for the Lakers. I remember sitting at Dunkin Donuts Baseball Stadium watching a young Francisco Alvarez hit a baseball so far out of the park while playing for the Mets minor league team. Recently Juan Soto signed a huge contract to play for the Mets. He will make a lot of money because of his youth and potential.

Music is another area where youth seem to really impact. Younger people can write amazing music that seems to last. I have always liked Steve Bell and have thought his early material was outstanding and memorable.

Sometimes we think things are too hard. Sometimes we look at a long memory verse and say that's impossible. Youth during Jesus' time memorized much of the Torah. Sometimes it is a matter of encouraging and providing hope to students and helping them do amazing things. Whether in the classroom or on the court, youth have the ability to make a lasting impact. It is our job to help them realize their full potential.
