From the Principal - Mr. Bob Morris

Happy Father's Day! Yes, this is an odd start for the final Bits and Bites of the 2023-2024 school year. Students get excited about various holidays and traditions during the school year. We are in session during Mother's Day and often students will make cards in class, but our school year is over by the time Father's Day is around.

I was thinking about the impact that fathers make in three different people I know. One was a high school classmate. She was a good friend in high school that was impacted by the loss of her dad when she was three years old. He died during the Vietnam War and her memories of her dad were based on pictures and stories. I attended a musical event recently. The event featured music that was performed by the son of one of the musicians. His dad was a famous musician and he spoke a lot during the performance about his dad, his dad's impact and how much he missed him. My most recent father impact was my personal experience by my father-in-law Kenneth Paddock who recently passed away. He always treated me well, accepting me into his family. He openly modeled his faith in God by praying for others and daily reading God's Word. I was blessed by him and will miss him.

We often look at Mother's Day as a day to bless moms. We give cards, gifts, try to find ways to do something for mom, maybe plan a special meal. I want to propose a different plan for Father's Day.

1 Kings 2:2-4: "I am about to go the way of all the earth," he said. "So be strong, show yourself a man, and observe what the Lord your God requires: Walk in his ways, and keep his decrees and commands, his laws and requirements, as written in the Law of Moses, so that you may prosper in all that you do and wherever you go, and that the Lord may keep his promise to me: 'If your descendants watch how they live, and if they walk faithfully before me with all their heart and soul, you will never fail to have a man on the throne of Israel.'

Matthew 3:16-17: As soon as Jesus was baptized, he went up out of the water. At that moment heaven was opened, and he saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove and lightning on him. And a voice from heaven said, "This is my Son, Whom I love; with him I am well pleased."

There should be a different perspective about Father's Day. Instead of looking at it like Mother's Day and hoping the kids mow the lawn on the weekend, wash the car, or cook steaks on the bbq for you, maybe shifting the perspective on you blessing your children. This can't be a one day a year event. David, while on his deathbed, blessed Solomon and gave him wise instruction. David didn't pass off his parental responsibilities to anyone else. He instructed Solomon to walk in the ways of the Lord. We could follow David's advice and encourage our children to walk in the ways of God. We can speak this to our children and also model that as well.

I often think about our Lord and Saviour. He gets baptized and his Father blesses Jesus with the affirming words: "This is my Son, Whom I love; and with him I am well pleased." There is something profound that our Saviour was publicly affirmed by God. We need to affirm and bless our children, modeled after the events in Matthew 3:16-17.

It's not really about what my daughters give me for Father's Day. It is about what I can give them, and I need to do this and model this to them more than one day a year. Have I been perfect? Far from it. Do I desire to want to bless them and see them grow in their faith - absolutely!

It is my prayer that you have a great summer holiday now that school is out. It is also my prayer that dad's shift their focus about Father's Day too.

School Review:

Whether it was completing the survey and/or coming in for an in-person interview, your time, efforts and opinions were very much appreciated. The Board did meet with Gayle Monsma (Prairie Centre for Christian Education) to go over the final results and we would like to highlight the following for Society:

- We can give thanks to the Lord, that the review was overwhelmingly positive. The review showed strong satisfaction among staff, parents and students.
- PCCE commended Ponoka Christian School for receiving very positive results especially
 in the categories of Christian Education, Academic Program, and Staff Quality. Gayle
 mentioned that if she were to pick any three areas that a school should be striving for
 positive results in, those would be her Top 3.
 - Christian Education: Staff, parents, and students all express appreciation for the integration of Christian values and principles into the school environment and curriculum.
 - Academic Program: General consensus that our academic program is strong, we have high academic standards and supportive teachers
 - Staff Quality: Staff members are highly regarded for their dedication, enthusiasm, knowledge, and commitment to fostering a Christian worldview among students.
- Some minor recommendations were made, and the Education Committee will be going into those in more depth in the new school year to see if there are areas where we can yet improve

We would also like to say farewell to each of our Grade 9 students. A huge congratulations to each one of you on graduating from PCS and we pray that as you move on to High School the Lord would be with each of you and that you all may continue to grow in your faith and knowledge of our Saviour and be witnesses of Him in this world and bring Him glory in all that you do.

School Supply List 2024-25

Kindergarten to Grade 9 students are REQUIRED to have the following items:

- Outside shoes/boots
- Inside/gym shoes with NON-SCUFF SOLES
- Lunch bag
- Backpack
- 2 boxes of tissues

Grades 6 – 9 students are required to purchase their own supplies:

- Pencil box/case
- Pencils at least 10
- Pens, either blue or black ink at least 5 (erasable preferred)
- White erasers 2
- Pen, red ink at least 1
- Pencil crayons
- Markers
- Graph paper 1 package with ½ cm squares
- Glue sticks 2
- Ruler
- Scissors
- REQUIRED: Texas Instrument TI-30Xa calculator
- 200-sheet package plain loose-leaf paper 1 package
- 200-sheet package lined loose-leaf paper at least 5 packages
- Dividers 6 dividers (1 divider/subject)
- Binders (4: 1.5in size or 6: 1in size)
- Math Geometry Set
- Highlighters (2-3 colors)
