## From the Principal – Mr. Bob Morris

Remembrance Day thoughts: Remembrance Day, observed on November 11, honours the sacrifices made by our Canadian military personnel during various armed conflicts or wars. It serves as a moving reminder of the cost of freedom and the importance of peace. I reflect back on my own family history with the loss of my grandfather's brother who died during World War One in France. His casket flag that sits on a bookshelf in the living room reminds me of his sacrifice that was made fighting the Germans. From a biblical perspective, the themes of sacrifice and remembrance are themes that we should reflect on.

In the Bible, remembrance is a significant concept. In Exodus 12, God commands the Israelites to observe the Passover as a way to remember their deliverance from slavery in Egypt. This act of remembrance not only acknowledges past suffering but also reinforces hope for future liberation. Similarly, Remembrance Day invites us to reflect on the sacrifices of those who fought for freedom, reminding us of the importance of honouring their legacy.

The biblical narrative emphasizes the value of laying down one's life for others (John 15:13). This selfless act is mirrored in the lives of soldiers who put themselves in harm's way for the sake of their country and fellow citizens. On Remembrance Day, we honor these sacrifices, recognizing that true valor lies in the willingness to protect and serve.

Ultimately, Remembrance Day, viewed through a biblical lens, calls us not only to remember the sacrifice that others have made in the past but also the ultimate sacrifice that our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ made on the cross, taking on our sins. It urges us to honor those who served by actively working towards a future free from conflict, embodying the principles of love and sacrifice that lie at the heart of our Christian faith.






